VATICAN STAMPS HONOUR IE2012 FR. JOHN TAKES UP HIS NEW POST

Special edition postage stamps have been issued by the Vatican to commemorate the 50th International Eucharistic Congress held in Dublin in June. The Vatican's Philatelic and Numismatic Office has produced 12 stamps for 2012, two of which are described as being "distinctly Irish". The images on these pay tribute to the land of Ireland and the sharing of the Gospel in Ireland. They include a Celtic Cross from the Rock of Cashel in Tipperary and the Ardagh Chalice. 



GALLERY NEWS

The "Gallery Choir" after its holiday will resume singing at the 10.30am Mass on Sunday 16^{th} September. We are still hoping that new members will join. There are no special requirements needed of previous musical knowledge.

The word "holiday" nowadays refers to a break from normal activities. However the origin of the word reveals a much deeper meaning, since the term "holiday" initially signified a free time in which one could attend religious services to commemorate a particular Saint or feast day.

The pre-industrial peasant worked for many less days that his/her modern counterpart. In 1570 James Pilkingtom, Bishop of Durham wrote "the labouring man will take his rest in the morning....at noon he must have his sleeping time... in the afternoon another rest....at night at the first strike of a clock he casteth down his tools..... The medieval calendar was also filled with Church holidays as well as vacation at Christmas and Easter.

The industrial revolution, in approximately 1800 brought about changes to working conditions which resulted in a twelve hour, seven day week. in 1882 enlightened thinkers implemented legislation that would reduce the number of hours worked and give holiday entitlement to all employees; thus creating time for leisure and relaxation.
