

'The beginning of the good news of Jesus
Christ, the Son of God.
As it is written in the prophet Isaiah,
'See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you,
who will prepare your way;
the voice of one crying out in the wilderness:
"Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths
straight"'.' (Mark 1:1-8)



The 2nd gospel, the gospel of Mark opens abruptly. No birth narrative. No childhood stories. After citing Isaiah and briefly introducing John the Baptist, the reader is left expectantly hanging on the hope that an even 'more powerful' character will emerge. These opening eight verses set a cracking pace that this compact gospel will maintain. It suggests an excitement and an urgency.

From these opening verses we know that this is a story, and we are at the 'beginning'. It will tell of 'Jesus Christ, the Son of God'. It will be 'good news'. In Rome these terms were used exclusively by the emperor. He was a 'Son of God'; his decrees 'good news'. It is a dramatic opening line that hits its reader with a bang!

The cited passage from Isaiah leaves us in no doubt that a story, a history foretold is now initiated by God. Mark's warning-less time-jump lands the reader in the middle of the Judean desert. John is systematically described as the archetypal prophet: proclaiming repentance, dressing wildly on a diet of insects and 'honey'. He doesn't sound the most appealing to us but the people flock to this new shepherd. They leave Jerusalem, confess their sins, undergo his baptism. His wilderness cry is hitting the mark. It is being heard. But in the only quoted words from John he points beyond this, to his mission: 'The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. I have baptised you with water; but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit'. The one coming after him will dwarf him. The stage is set. The expectation raised. The reader hooked...

We know how the story unfolds – we have heard it countless times. Today, as a Church, as a parish and people of faith, we can feel like a voice crying in the wilderness. We must ask ourselves, is our message *hitting the mark?* Are people flocking to hear this message? Doesn't seem so – and if not, we have to ask ourselves why?

Maybe the question is 'Who we are pointing to?'
Are we messengers of the Good News in our community?

Do we really know, understand, witness to and accept Jesus who we are preparing for this Christmas? Who is this Christ we proclaim? Do we radiate this excitement, urgency and awe? In essence – *Who is the Jesus that people meet when they meet us, visit our parish or come to our Church?* Therein lies our challenge this Advent!


people of the Parish for their continued support.



The way we have prepared children for **First Holy** Communion and the Sacrament of Reconciliation has changed over the years. While the schools are doing a fantastic job through Religious Education sometimes parents are struggling to make sense of it all. Most of the preparation has been done in school

and recognizing the dedicated work taken on by the teachers, the parish will now, more and more, get involved with the preparation. We, the Parish of Clondalkin, are offering families opportunities to become involved with the journey over the next few months. Christina will invite children to come to the church once a month to explore the building, learn the liturgical year and get to know children from the other parish schools.

We also invite parents to meet once a month to explore the liturgical seasons as well as look at the bigger picture of what "faith got to do with my daily life". We hope parents will connect with their own faith, ask questions and learn that there is more to the preparation than the day of the First Holy Communion.

The Parish Team is exploring the Diocesan policy which ask the Ceremony to be celebrated on a Sunday during the normal Mass instead of a Saturday as now prevails.
