You would probably agree that there is no such thing as a perfect Family!

Today Sunday 11th, I am inviting you to join me on our local pilgrimage "Clon-mino". For the second year we are taking on this pilgrimage through Clondalkin as one parish community. If you would like to join us for a part of the pilgrimage or the whole walk — either way I would be delighted to see you. (there is a timetable inside).

The theme for this year's pilgrimage is "FAMILY". It is both part of celebrations for Ecumenical Bible week and beginning our preparations for the "World Meeting of the Families" being hosted in Ireland in August 2018. Over those five days we will celebrate with our brothers and sisters from around the world the joy, the challenges and the blessings that Families / Family life brings.

You would probably agree that there is no such thing as a *perfect Family*! Looking at my own I have experienced that Family life can be busy, life-giving, tiring, scary and adventurous – but at the heart of it - it is real – it is full of life – it is love. It comes with challenges and blessings. With love and tears. Not one day is like another.

Every day we have a new (little) arguments.

For example: With my five year old daughter, Grace about what to wear or my three year old who decided that she doesn't like vegetables anymore.

Every day we have new love stories.

For example Daddy has to hug and kiss every family member before going to work otherwise there will be tears! Or Grace the other morning when she told me that she cannot imagine a life without her 8 month old brother – she loves him so much.

Every day we share tears and laughter.

At least once a day I hear "She hit me" or "I had that toy first" – and the next moment the girls are singing and dancing through the kitchen. Reconciliation at its best!

My family is far from perfect but for me – that it is not important! For me it is important that it is real! I hope and wish my children grow up in a family where we respect one another – we love each other – we argue – we reconcile – we pray - we laugh and cry together.

Today I invite you to think about your own family. When was the last time you spoke

to your sister/brother? When was the last time you said "I am sorry"? When was the last time you danced around the kitchen?

I hope to see you on the pilgrimage walk today, when we can share our stories and experiences of family life, when we walk and pray



together as one family of God and celebrate our faith as one family.

is "FAMILY"




We start our journey with mass in Knockmitten at 10am. From there we walk to and rest for a moment in all of the Churches and various places of religious significance throughout the CCPC.

Feel free to join us for a whole pilgrimage or for a part of it.


