DEAR YOUNG PEOPLE. DO ΝΟΤ BURY YOUR TALENTS THE GIFTS THAT GOD HAS GIVEN YOU! DO NOT BE AFRAID TO DREAM OF GREAT THINGS! -POPE FRANCIS

Since the 3rd of October the Synod of Bishops on Young people (Youth, Faith and vocational discernment) has been taking place in Rome. Pope Francis has invited Bishops from all over the world to listen to lay people, religious and many others who have their own experience through their ministry and / or lived experience. In order to hear from young people from all over Ireland an online survey called "the big April ask" had been set up to deal with what young people in Ireland really think about the church, their local parish, their engagement, connection, etc. This survey helped the Irish Bishops to be as prepared as they could be to listen to others and share their irish experience. Having seen some of the feedback of "the big

April ask" – we as a church are challenged to listen to our young people with an open mind, open heart and open ears. If we really want to know what helps them, what they are missing and where their passions lie, WE MUST TRULY LISTEN.

Unfortunately many feel disconnected, not heard and sometimes not listened to. However in January 2019 some young people from the CCPC are representing all

young people from our parish, our pastoral area or deanery when they travel to the World Youth Day in Panama. We, as a parish, should be proud that we are represented in a group of 30 pilgrims travelling from the Dublin diocese. These young adults are the present and the future leaders of the Catholic Church.



Over the next few weeks we will find out more about these pilgrims. Let us pray that today's responsorial psalm comes alive for many of our young people. Let us pray that they experience the love of God.

Because he never jumps off the ship of our life; he is always there at life's crossroads. Even when our lives go up in flame, he is always there to rebuild them!
