STORIES JESUS TOLD

One of the interesting marks of Jesus' ministry is how much of his teaching is told through storytelling. He was a master storyteller whose parables captivated his listeners. He didn't use the language of the scribes or the solemn style of the priests in Jerusalem. He talked about life; about farmers and fishermen,



sowing and harvesting, the lost and the found, the wise and the foolish, the accepted and the rejected. He talked about God. He gave his listeners a different view of life; God is good, his goodness fills everything, his mercy embraces everyone. He spoke of the "Kingdom of God" and how life would take on a different meaning if God had his way. He wanted to put people in touch with their own experience so that they could open up to the experience of God in their lives. He invited them to leave the old



conventional world of closed-in ideas and savour the freshness of the "Kingdom of God". His purpose was clear: "With what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable will we use for it? " and again " The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed..... yeast a woman

took and mixed with flour.... a treasure hidden in a field... it can be compared to a man who sowed wheat in his field. Through his parables Jesus made God present in a way that the teachers of the law did not. His parables were moving and thought-provoking; they touched peoples' hearts and invited them to open up to God. The people welcomed the parables as "good news". Jesus did not explain their meaning. The parable had to penetrate its hearers." Those who have ears to hear let them hear" Those who listened as spectators would miss the point. Those who resisted would remain outside. But those who made the story their own and allowed its power to transform them would "bear much fruit". On this Sunday and for the following two Sundays we have the parables of Jesus for our Gospel readings. There are eight in all over the three Sundays.



Like the people in Jesus' time we are invited to enter into their movement, to listen with the ears of our heart and to meet **'the challenge to change'** they offer us. Sr. Anne
