It seems that there are two basic ways of helping people, and each is illustrated somehow in today's first and third readings.

The first way is by actively doing things for others, prompted or unprompted.
This is shown in the lavish hospitality with which Abraham welcomes his three unexpected guests and also by the



industrious care with which Martha welcomes Jesus in her house at Bethany. In a lot of cases this way of helping people, by active service, is assuredly the best kind of help we can give. But there is another way which is just as beneficial - perhaps even more beneficial in some cases - and which consists in simply listening, giving time and being there for others. Many people are lonely, desolate, depressed and what they need most is a shoulder to cry on, a friendly ear. They don't need our services, they need our loving ear, our un-interrupting and judgmental listening, our compassionate presence. Listening and giving some of our precious time to a person in distress with all our heart is sometimes the greatest act of love we can perform!

It's also interesting that both ways of helping begin with an unconditional welcoming and acceptance of the other person—not always the easiest thing to do! That said we each need to search for balance. I mustn't expect others to carry certain gifts for me forever while I make no effort at all. If I am a Martha I am grateful that there are Mary's to carry the possibility of meditation for me, but I must attempt to enter into it myself. And if I am a Mary I thank God for Marthas who serve to remind me that I too must attempt to serve.

The Gospel is always challenging us to welcome now, to live now, to give now, to love now. Now is the only real time. Martha and Mary show us how to live in the now.

So reflecting on this Gospel my prayer knowing the busy-ness of my week ahead is-

Lord of all things, since I'll have no time this week to be a saint by doing lofty deeds, or watching late with you, or dreaming into the dawn light, or storming heaven's gates, make me a saint by getting meals, fixing the shed, washing the clothes and plates, tidying the garden and taxi-ing my children! In all that I do may I recognize you, welcome you and make time for you in others. **Amen.**
