



"I thought God had abandoned me"

Ann Carroll and I had the privilege once again of visiting Fr. Bala in India this time to see his new parish which consists of 17 villages and part of the town of Badvel. His tasks once again is to develop a new Parish which is named St. Mother Teresa's. We found Fr. Bala enthusiastically working to meet the needs of his parishioners both spiritually and materially with the support of friends

in Ireland. For the first time he has the help of a newly ordained curate Fr. Suresh.



As usual we received a warm welcome from villagers and from Fr. Bala's family. There were great celebrations in two villages which had received bore wells. One of these villages previously had no water, forcing villagers to walk many miles to obtain water. The other village received 5 bore wells which irrigates 25 acres of land and

allows 6 different crops to grow on land that was previously arid. The growing of these crops gives employment to 25 men and enables them to feed their families and to sell surplus produce in the local market.

We found peoples' lives transformed by improved housing conditions and improved medical attention. Many of the elderly people are receiving food, clothing and blankets. We also met village children whose education we are sponsoring.

Unfortunately we found many people in great need of the basics for living, but we could only empathise with them for now and hope in the future through funds raised to assist them. DO NOT PASS BY A MAN IN NEED, FOR YOU MAY BE THE hand of God TO HIM.
