



looking after mid-day on Good Friday and Noel and Carolyn for once again looking after the Taize Stations of the Cross on Good Friday Night.



Healthy Aging Study

We are looking for non-smoking men and women (aged 65 years and over) who may have low muscle and/or low strength to take part in a study to examine whether a food-based nutritional supplement can improve muscle and strength. What's involved? We will ask you to come to UCD where we will test your muscle mass (the amount of muscle in your body) and your strength. If it is low you will be invited to participate in the NUTRIMAL Nutrition and Healthy Aging Study. The study will involve consuming a juice-based drink twice per day for 6 months and visiting UCD 4 times over this period.

A Word from the Parish Finance Committee

You may be aware of the recent implication of changes in the charities legislation. Because of these changes we have made some amendments to our accounting procedures. For example, we must acknowledge all monies received for the Family

Offering, Easter and Christmas Dues, or any other reason either by post or through the sacristy or parish office. Best practice also suggests that any cheques made out to the Parish should be made out to 'Clondalkin Parish Church' and not to an

individual. By now we would normally have published our accounts for 2016/2017. However, the Archdiocese changed their accounting year to run parallel with the tax year. We have submitted our accounts for 2017 to the Archdiocese who reviewed and accepted them. As with all parishes an external auditor will review them and when this is complete we will be able to publish them. I gather this could be in June. In the meantime, thank you to all our house to house contributors, collectors and counters.

Should you wish to set up a standing order please contact Mrs Brett in the Parish Office. If you contributed over €250 to the Parish in Family Offering or Dues during 2017 the Parish may be able to claim the charity tax back at **no extra cost** to you. These forms will be available from the Parish Office.


During Lent did you notice that sometimes when we' gave up something we can have a stern, unhappy or even angry face!? Sometimes when we prank someone we can make them sad, even make

April Fool's Day is a Catholic Thing!!

Okay, so it isn't *really* Catholic thing per se, but the origin of April Fool's Day is actually found in the Church. A lot of people don't know this, so here's how the story goes.



On February 24, 1582, Pope Gregory XIII issued the papal bull (official Letter) called 'Inter Gravissimas' which established the Gregorian calendar (the calendar we use now which gets it's name from this pope) as the official calendar for the Christian world. With this pronouncement, the older, roman Julian calendar was replaced and the first day of the new year was moved to January 1. Those who continued to observe the start of the New Year on April 1, whether out of resistance or because they didn't receive the news, were considered foolish and ridiculed. Thus April Fools!!

So if someone pulls a prank or plays a joke on you on April 1st, you can legitimately blame Pope Gregory XIII!! Sometimes we don't even realise the good contributions the Church has made to society. Once we realize that, then we're one step closer to realizing how important the Church is to our daily life.
