


THE WEDDING AT CANA

There was a wedding in Cana, a small village in Galilee. The mother of Jesus was there but her personal name is not given. Neither are the names of the disciples of Jesus. The names of the bride and groom are not given nor is their relationship to

Jesus and his family specified. The servants and chief steward of the feast are not named. Jesus is the only named person at the wedding. Everyone else is described according to their relationship to Jesus or their function at the wedding feast.

The wine runs short but the reason is not given. The mother of Jesus notices the shortage and draws her son's attention to it. "They have no wine" she says. He hesitates but she orders the servants to do his bidding. "Do whatever he tells you". Jesus orders them to fill the water jars, each containing over a hundred gallons, and carry some to the chief steward who praises the quality of the water made wine. "The best wine was kept until now" was his comment.

At Cana the mother of Jesus took on a new role. Introduced into the story as the mother of Jesus and addressed by Jesus, not as mother but as "woman", put her in the context of the great women and mothers of the Bible who intervened at crucial moments in history to secure the future.

Thank you Mary for your presence at the wedding in Cana. You intervened when a problem arose and did not take "no" for an answer.

You set the ministry of Jesus in motion by initiating the first of his signs/miracles.

You trusted in his word and urged others to do his bidding. You stood by him when at last his "hour" came. On Calvary, you heard yourself being addressed again as "woman" and became mother of us all. Thank you for Cana.

WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHURCH UNITY

Commenced on Friday 18th Jan and ends on 25th Jan - *Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul.* Let's join our prayers to Jesus' own prayer: "that they all may be one".

This year the theme is "Only Justice" and The prayers for 2019 have been prepared by Christians from Indonesia, the largest country in South East Asia, made up of more than 17,000 islands, 1,340 different ethnic groups and over 740 local languages, united by one national language Bahasa Indonesia. With some 86% of its 260 million people estimated to be Muslim, it has the largest Islamic population of any country. About 10% of Indonesians are Christian. Indonesians have lived by the principle of gotong royong which is to live in 'solidarity and by collaboration', regarding all Indonesians as brothers and sisters

"On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Now both Jesus and His disciples were invited to the wedding. And when they ran out of wine, the mother of Jesus said to Him, 'They have no wine...Now there were six stone water jars set there for the Jewish custom of purification, containing twenty to thirty


gallons each." (*John 2:1-3, 6*)

The photo shows the type of water jars used 1st century AD according to Israeli archaeologists, excavating a 2,000-year-old stone quarry and production center for stone vessels not far from the ancient city of Cana where Jesus performed his first recorded miracle, turning water into wine.

Archaeologists uncovered a small cave during construction work for a municipal sports centre. They are excavating two sites at Reina, just south of the modern village of Kafr Kanna in the lower Galilee. Scholars believe Kafr Kanna may be the site of biblical Cana.

"The reason for this choice of material seems to have been religious. According to ancient Jewish ritual law, vessels made of pottery are easily made impure and must be broken. Stone, on the other hand, was thought to be a material that can never become ritually impure, and as a result ancient Jews began to produce some for their everyday tableware from stones, It is possible that large stone containers of the type mentioned in the wedding at Cana of Galilee story may have been produced locally in Galilee."
