CELEBRATING PENTECOST

Pentecost, a Greek word referring to the 50th day is celebrated by both Jew and Christian. This Sunday, the Jewish feast of Pentecost called Shavuot coincides with the Christian feast. Shavuot in Hebrew means "Weeks" referring to the seven weeks or fifty days since the

Passover, Likewise the Christian feast of Pentecost marks the end of the seven weeks of Eastertide, our Christian Passover.

In biblical times Shavuot was one of three pilgrimage festivals in the Jewish calendar. It marked the beginning of the Harvest Holiday when Jews offered a grain offering along with the regular burnt offering. The grain was to be the first fruits of new grain harvested from the land. After the destruction of the temple in 70 CE Shavuot was connected with Moses receiving the Ten Commandments on Mount Sinai, seven weeks after the exodus from Egypt. The reason why so many people from all languages were gathered in Jerusalem and witnessed the spectacular events described in our first reading from Acts2, is that they were there to celebrate the Old Testament festival of Pentecost. They were astonished to hear Peter and the Apostles "preaching in our own language the marvels of God."

Christians associate Pentecost with the coming of the Spirit and the



outpouring of the gifts of the Spirit. It is the birthday of the Church, the People of God. The Jews celebrate their becoming God's people when they accepted the Ten commandments "I will be your God and you will be my people". They offer the first fruits of the harvest.

They celebrate Shavuot, their Pentecost. St. Paul in the second reading says "the Spirit is our life."

We have the first fruits of the Spirit.

Let us also celebrate our Pentecost, our life in the Spirit. Sr. Anne
