#### The Church of Krispy Kreme and the faithful followers of Johnny Logan


Nearly two months on from the World Meeting of Families I was reflecting on the week itself, the Papal visit and how the event was perceived by

believers and non-believers alike. Certainly, there were issues with the ticketing and the transport to and from the Phoenix Park which didn't help. There was a certain mocking of those who rose early, made the long journey to the Phoenix Park and braved the elements on the Sunday of the Papal Mass. Equally, those who tried to see the Pope on the streets in Dublin, Croke Park or Knock were described as old fashioned, foolish or just not representative of modern Ireland.

I am not alone in thinking that modern Ireland is represented by a new 'church' that opened recently in Blanchardstown. The church of Krispy Kreme has attracted so many followers that a gueue formed, and the devoted ones spent up to six hours waiting to buy doughnuts! An added amusement to myself is that social media was alight with contributors rejoicing in this news. At a recent Johnny Logan concert, the good man welcomed all his loyal fans, most of whom were Irish and had followed him since they were young. Some had even brought their own now teenage or adult children. A sizeable portion of the audience was made up of fans who had come from overseas, ignoring the fact that their hero is scorned in his home country. The World Meeting of Families attracted many families from overseas who made considerable effort and sacrifices to get to Dublin. In the Phoenix Park it was great to see so many young Irish families and families who have made Ireland their home.

Today is Mission Sunday. Traditionally, we associated "mission" with Irish people going overseas to spread the Gospel. Today we are called to mission to each other. We welcome those from overseas involved in our Parish and we remember those who preach the Gospel under difficult circumstances.




Newly canonized St Paul VI led the church from 1863 until his death August 6th 1978. His Encyclical "Humanae Vitae" caused divisions within the Catholic Church worldwide. A letter written by Padre Pio shortly before his death in 1968 illustrates the sympathy Padre Pio

had for the Pope "I know that your heart suffers much these day on account of the happenings in the Church, for peace in the world, for the great needs of its peoples, but above all for the lack of obedience of some even Catholics, to the lofty teachings which you, assisted by the Holy Spirit has given us.....asking the Lord to comfort you with his grace to continue along the direct yet often burdensome way in defense of these eternal truths which can never change with the times". The letter concludes with Padre Pio thanking the Pope for "his clear and decisive words" and offering him his prayers and sufferings.

For those who asked that his picture be erected we have set the wheels in motion and hope that Pope Paul VI will take his place beside the other Pope saints in the Church soon. Canonized with Pope Paul VI Oscar Romero is the first Salvadoran saint. He was born on August 15, 1917. He was gunned down during Mass in a hospital chapel March 24, 1980, a day after telling an army made up largely of peasants that they were killing their own people.

"We have never preached violence, except the violence of love, which left Christ nailed to a Cross, the Violence that we must each do to ourselves to overcome our selfishness and such Cruel inequalities among US". (Oscar Romero)
