
providing training for Baptismal Preparation Teams, why should it be repeated elsewhere?



GALLERY NEWS

On Sunday, 23rd September the Gallery Choir will sing Liam Lawton's "Cloud's Veil". Lawton is a skilled lyricist. He also writes his own words that are inspired by actual experiences of scenic beauty.

Often great composers, such as Handel, who composed the Messiah, collaborate with librettists who give shape to the words that are to be set to music. Not many people are aware of the person who wrote the text for Handel's oratorio. He was called Charles Jennens born in 1700 and died in 1747. Jennens lived for a year with Handel writing the script of a work that sounds as fresh today as it did in the 18thcentury. When the composition was finished Handel wrote at the end of the manuscript: "to God alone give glory". The combination of a superb script, the music and arrangement caused Haydn to remark "he is the greatest of all" and surely some of the extravagant praise must also partly be given to Charles Jennens.
