## Seeds of Faith...

Once again in this week's Gospel passage, images of growing trees, shrubs and plants provide us with powerful insights into the quiet and slow ways that God's Kingdom grows among us and within us. Jesus' parables are a master class in how to meet people where they are. Jesus could have just as easily made the point,



"there are always problems!" and been done with it, but his parables make the point much more vibrant and the reasoning behind it much more clear.

Like the parable of the Wheat and Weeds. It comes with an interpretation that Jesus explains to the disciples. As you listen to or read today's Gospel who do you identify with? Do you have a picture of who were the weeds and who were the wheat? Where do you put yourself? It sounds clear cut, doesn't it? There is good and there is evil! There is the good young man, Harry Potter and there is the evil wizard Lord Voldemort. There is Luke Skywalker and Darth Vader. Batman and the Joker. Cowboys in white hats and baddies in black hats. It's obvious who is wheat and who is weed - isn't it? Or is it? The growth of God's Kingdom is the result of God's power, not ours. The judgement is not ours to make. Gandhi once said, "I like your Christ. I do not like your Christians. Your Christians are so unlike Christ!" We are not asked to be Christ but be Christ-like. So who is this Christ we are bearing witness to through our words, actions and lives and does it really make a difference? I believe so. In essence the Gospel message is one of true love, acceptance and forgiveness. This is our faith. Like the tiny mustard seed, the Kingdom of God is something that grows from a tiny beginning. We have the seed of faith planted in our hearts as do others. We are asked to water it with prayer and to deepen our relationship with God; to foster and fertilize it with the Word of God & forgiveness; to cultivate it with radical openness and love, and to bear & share fruit through selfless acts of mercy, kindness and compassion. Not an easy task but a truly transforming one!

As we start into another week make an effort to look after your own seed of faith and nurture the seeds of others. And, as you do, take comfort and courage from a favorite quote attributed to Oscar Romero – "It helps, now and then, to step back and take a long view. The Kingdom is not only beyond our efforts, it is even beyond our vision. We accomplish in our lifetime only a tiny fraction of the magnificent enterprise that is God's work. Nothing we do is complete, which is a way of saying that the Kingdom always lies beyond us. This is what we are about. We plant the seeds that one day will grow. We water seeds already planted, knowing that they hold future promise. We lay foundations that will need further development. We provide yeast that produces far beyond our capabilities. We cannot do everything and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that. This enables us to do something, and to do it very well. It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest." Frank Brown PPW



Saints whose Feast Days occur this week

St. Bridget of Sweden: 23rd July - In 1999, Pope John Paul II made her, along with St. Catherine of Sienna and Sister Teresa Benedicta (Edith Stein), one of three co-patronesses of Europe.

St. Declan of Lismore: 24th July - Declan's generosity was proverbial and beggars followed him wherever he went. In his last days, he sought refuge "in a narrow place beside the sea" - called Declan's Desert - and it was there he died on 24th July.

St. James the Apostle: 25th July - St. James was one of the Twelve Apostle of Jesus and traditionally considered the first Apostle to be martyred. He was son of Zebedee and Salome and brother of John the Apostle.

Sts Joachim and Anne: 26th July - This was recognized by the General Rome Calendar 1969 which contains only those celebrations that are intended to be observed in the Roman Rite in every country in the world. Saints Joachim and Anne are the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

St. Martha: 29th July - St. Martha of Bethany is the patron of active, practical women, perhaps unfairly contrasted with her more laid back "contemplative" sister Mary. But Martha is also the woman of faith, who said "I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who was to come into the world" (Jn 11:27)
