Today we had my niece Yvonne Ryder, a worker with the charity Concern. Yvonne came to tell us of her unique experiences in countries she has been sent to in the last couple of years. She told us briefly of some of her experiences in countries like Afghanistan, Haiti, Somalia and North Korea to name a few. She told us of living conditions and customs in those countries. In Afghanistan she did not see many women, and if she did they were completely covered. Yvonne had to cover up too while there. In other places she did not have too, but respectfully dressed was ok. No minis or low tops. In Haiti crime is very prevalent and it is not safe to go out alone. It is very poverty stricken and people try to make an income from very little. In North Korea, freedom of movement is ok, but one is under observation all the time, even in the markets. It seems to be a very restrictive county in freedom of movement and speech, however, the experience there was good. Thank you Yvonne for coming this morning and telling us about your visits there in a very clear, and humorous way, giving us a glimpse of life there.
