Today's Gospel has always been one To make a difference that unsettled me. The parable of Lazarus and the rich man paints a dramatic scene of contrasts - riches and poverty, heaven and hell, compassion and indifference, inclusion exclusion. It's a story in which we see an abrupt and dramatic reversal of

fortune - in the end the rich man became a beggar!

In the story you also have a poor man called Lazarus but the rich man is nameless - as if to emphasise that in spite of all his money and all the power and influence that comes with it, he is a Nobody! The central message of this story seems to lie fates of these two individuals after death and is very much tied to their experiences of wealth and poverty in this life. What is very striking is that the rich man is not presented as being cruel to Lazarus or mistreating him. He was 'condemned' for doing nothing, for seeing the miserable state of Lazarus and doing nothing about it. I think it was the French playwright Moliere who said, 'It is not only for what we do that we are held responsible, but also for what we do not do.'

When I was in training for the role of Parish Pastoral Worker we were advised that when we went to a parish to spend time observing, listening to the 'voices' of the parish to really get to know the needs of the parish and community. What I have come to realise over years is that quite often those who need the most have no voice so no amount of 'listening' will ever hear them, they are also quite often the invisible issues that are hidden in plain sight! This is what I think I find most unsettling about this reading, it throws down the gauntlet to me to ask myself when I have noticed them but not seen them... when I have heard them but not listened to them?

In essence Luke 16 is not just about money or wealth. When we really understand the chapter, the key elements are personal relationships and solidarity. Almsgiving and charitable acts are good but personal involvement is better and to be involved means first to notice and see, to hear and listen. Pope Francis in Evangelii Gaudium says, 'Each individual Christian and every community is called to be an instrument of God for the liberation and promotion of the poor, and for enabling them to be fully a part of society. This demands that we be docile and attentive to the cry of the poor and to come to their aid.' 187

The comfort I will take with me this week then is - 'To make a difference in someone's life you don't have to be brilliant, rich, beautiful, or perfect. You Just have to care enough and be there' (Unknown) - I pray, that with God's help, I can Frank Brown, Parish Pastoral Worker and I do.







I just wanted to share a simple work of Mercy with you that has meant a lot to me. Over a year ago my younger sister died unexpectedly. It was a horrific and



tumultuous time for family and friends. As with any funeral there were friends and family that we had not seen for years that came together in grief, to give their support and comfort. As the days afterwards turned to weeks and the weeks to months the number of people calling, keeping touch dramatically dwindled to the point that it seemed my sister's name became only spoken amongst close family and friends, only came into focus at her month's mind or birthday. I know life moves on but it was in those following months that the reality, the loss and grief became harder to deal with. But, as I said, life seemed to move on and her loss seemed like 'old news'. Throughout this time there has been one, much unexpected and extremely welcome exception. At the funeral I had met an old primary school pal that I hadn't seen in years and had lost contact with and we exchanged numbers. Since then and even now, almost twice a week and at times when I have most needed it, I would get a text or whatsapp message from him that is as simple as, "Was thinking of you, I hope your doing well!" or "Keeping you in the prayers."

A simple gesture that has meant so much. PM
