

## Let go to Begin Again:

An Invitation for us All

As we journey through life we often unknowingly find ourselves letting go of things, of emotions, of friendships and indeed loved ones. In many ways life itself is a continuous process of letting go in order to begin again. This process begins with birth itself - letting go of the warmth and safety of the womb in order to embrace and begin the experience of life in the world. Letting go is a part



of every step on the journey of our human condition and brings with it all the emotional experience that accompanies us on our fragile pathway.

Letting go doesn't mean we don't care. Letting go doesn't mean we shut down. It means that we stop resisting the way things are. It means that we stop trying to do the impossible, trying to control that which we cannot, and instead focus on what is possible, taking care of ourselves. We do this with as much gentleness, kindness and love as possible.

The greatest thing at any moment is to be willing to give up who we are in order to become all that we can be. This is a very hopeful invitation that is realised through God in our lives. We all need to let go. Many of our lives may be bruised or indeed weighed down by baggage that limits our desire and potential for freedom and contentment. In this regard, there is an enormous desire for healing in all our hearts. Healing is that very beautiful process of letting go in order to begin again in the new life and opportunities that God gives us this day.
