INDULGENCES FOR THE DECEASED

The Catechism tells us that “Indulgences are the remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven”

Indulgences, applicable only to those who have died, can be obtained by

1. From noon 1st November until midnight 2nd November going to confessions, Holy Communion and praying for the Pope's intentions. Confessions can be obtained as near as possible to the date.
2. Visiting a cemetery and pray for the dead from 1st to 8th November and a partial indulgence during the month of November.
