It deals with many

The answer to the riddle last week is: A Glove. Easy!! I learned to make St. Brigid's Cross this week. My teacher brought in rushes. My first attempt was really terrible but with her encouragement all the children in my class went home with a Cross. As we were making the crosses she told us this story as to how the cross came about: There was an old pagan Chieftain who lay dying in Kildare and his servants summoned Brigid to his beside in the hope she may calm his restless spirit. Brigid sat by his bed, consoling and calming him and she picked up the rushes from the floor and began weaving them into cross pattern. Whilst she weaved, she explained the meaning of the cross to the sick man and her calming words brought peace to his soul, and the old Chieftain requested he be baptized as a Christian just before he died. I would like to be as brave as St. Brigid and not run away if I saw someone in trouble. The Feast of St Blaise is Fri, Feb 3rd. Not much is known about St Blaise except that he is the patron saint of sore throats and wild animals. More is known about devotion to him rather than his life itself. Two candles

are blessed, crossed over and pressed against either side of one's throat as a blessing is said. Throats will be blessed at all Masses.

"May Blaise protect you from the common cold and sore throat, hacking cough and snuffy nose. May Mother Mary's candles light your road and at the end of the day bring sweet repose& may God, who tells the stories of His love through the saints, who love us too, bless you" - an old Irish Blessing

Monday Club 23 January 2017

We had a very interesting morning when Sr Anne from the Presentation Convent very kindly came into the club to tell us of the history of the Presentation Sisters in our parish. It began in 1810 by Mrs. Caldbeck who had a school for girls at the gate lodge to Moyle Park. On Mrs. Caldbeck's death in 1840 she left a sum of £2,000 to curate Fr Moore to establish a convent for teaching nuns. The land (20 acres) was purchased for this in 1844. Today we have this beautiful Gothic Style convent and church. On 7 Dec 1857 three Sisters travelled from Carlow to Clondalkin via Lucan and were they were welcomed by Fr Moore and parishioners. By the generosity of their neighbours the nuns were given furniture etc. which make the convent habitable for them as there was no furniture there when they arrived—they also got a cow!! On the 8 December there was Solemn High Mass and Blessing and 212 children were enrolled in school. A week later there was interest in joining the nuns by some local women and the rest is history. The nuns were very highly educated and skilled people and made a huge difference to the local people. Many would have been very poor people and the nuns were very industrious and engaged some local women in home industry.

Thank God we still have the nuns with us to the present day. The Sisters have played a huge role in the education of our young people and still doing so to the present day. They are engaged in teaching throughout the world and as we can see the world has come to them for education here in Clondalkin. Thank You Sr Anne for your detailed account of the history of the convent. May God provide more young women to dedicate themselves to the service of God in this very special way. During this week I hope to get rushes to make St Brigid's Crosses in preparation for St Brigid's Day on 1st February. Frank Hegarty hopefully will be available us to teach us.

The candles are presented for blessing during Mass and they then can be collected from the Parish Shop. There is something very encouraging and consoling to have a blessed candle lit in times of grief and indeed in

times you want to say "Thanks" to God.

> The Seventh Commandment - "You Shall Not Steal" Theft directly violates this Commandment and is the offence against the seventh precept which most people first recognise. Even if it does not contradict the

provisions of the civil law, any form of unjustly taking or keeping the property of others is against this Commandment. The Catechisms definition of theft is much broader in its demands & implications. It goes beyond merely taking what is not ours. It has implications for social justice and encompasses the social doctrine of the Church inspired by the Holy Spirit. Reparation for injustices committed against the Commandment requires restitution. 
