

Jesus – the Life and the Resurrection.



Entering the church today you may notice that the statues and crucifixes are covered in purple and wonder why!

Today is the beginning of two weeks of 'passiontide' -The first week is known as the Passion Week and from next Sunday we enter Holy Week.

It has long been the tradition to cover crucifixes and statues. It recalls the Gospel story of "They picked up stones to throw at Him, but Jesus hid himself and went out of the Temple". The veiling of the crucifixes and statues symbolizes the fact that Christ's Divinity was hidden at the time of His Passion and death, the very essence of Passiontide.


