### THE PRAYER JESUS TAUGHT HIS DISCIPLES



"Lord teach us to pray" this is what we read of in last Sunday's Gospel where the closest friends of the Lord ask Him how to pray. This indicates that they were not satisfied with their own efforts. People still ask this question today - books on how to pray and meditate are still being sold as there is a great yearning for prayer and praying well.

Last week I was on Clare Island in Co. Mayo and it was a very nice trip in a beautiful part of Ireland. The island church is about I mile from the harbour beside an old Cistercian Monastery. I spent an hour in the Church and the time flew. I could easily have stayed another hour but I had to go back to the harbour to catch the ferry to the mainland. In that simple island church prayer came easy to me. Felt close to God, everything was relaxed, harmonious and still.

St. Ignatius of Loyola the great mystic who founded the Jesuit Order called this the consolation of prayer. He also told us about its opposite - the desolation of prayer. Prayer comes easy at a time of consolation as it did for me on Clare Island but there will come a time when prayer is very difficult and St. Ignatius warned us to expect it. God is distant on even absent and we are restless and distracted. St. John of the Cross the other great mystic and contemporary of St. Ignatius called it the "dark night of the soul". Both Ignatius and John of the Cross calls regarded the period of desolation as being very valuable and necessary because it makes us grow. If prayer were always consoling we would get what St. John of the Cross calls a spiritual sweet tooth, we would never grow up spiritually.

All the great saints experienced great consolation in prayer - some of them went into ecstasy and lost themselves in the presence of God. But they all went into periods of desolation too - they had dark nights of the soul.

When we encounter a period of desolation let us first remember that trying to pray is praying, indeed our trying is all the more valuable to God when things are difficult. This is a time for short prayers like the Our Father which Jesus teaches to his disciples in Sunday's Gospel. It is short, easy to remember and is in fact the perfect prayer taught to us by God Himself. If we have the courage to persevere in prayer during our times of desolation then consolation will come as I experienced in a little country church on Clare Island last week. You don't have to go to Clare Island to experience this, if you have the humility to bloom where you are planted you can experience it anywhere, be it Clondalkin, Dublin City, New York or Timbuktu.

On behalf of all parishioners we thank the organisers for their generosity and care for the older people in our parish!


