We are just one month into 2019 and Christmas celebrations, New Year's seem to be a far distant memory. It's amazing how quickly life and routine takes over. Unrest, Brexit, strikes, tragedies ... and the weather warnings dominate and suffocate the news. We can so easily get swept along in a wave of routine, negativity and mundane. But today's readings, which unfortunately will be heard by a minority in our community, give an awesome reassurance, hope and message that , if we truly listened and believed it, is transformative and much

needed! We are loved. Not a fashionable thing to say these days! But YOU are loved and you matter. Not a plastic, fleeting love that passes on a whim of emotion but a love that is unconditional and unending. Even when you do not love yourself, your world, your community or even your Church – God loves you and never leaves you alone no matter how dark, alone or despondent things seem. Our faith gives us the truth that we are worthy and worth it! In the first reading from Jeremiah we hear that we were created and loved into existence - "Before I formed you in the womb knew you, and were born consecrated you..." St Paul in the second reading gives his beautiful hymn to love as the greatest of all virtues, a scripture passage that is often used at weddings. "So faith, hope, love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love." Faith and hope together are the human but God-given response to love. And faith and hope enable us to live within and to express the love in which we are created and held. Through faith and hope we open the way for love to bring us into the fullness of our individuality, of our humanity – to be the best ME I can be! Through faith and hope, love creates us, and in this love, through faith and hope, we become co-creators with God. True love is not passive, selfish or self - centred but should lead us to share this message, BE this message of good news to our community. The Gospel reminds us of the reality that this is not an easy thing to do ... "Truly I tell you, no prophet is accepted in his own hometown." Are we ready to truly accept that we are loved? And if so are we willing to be witnesses to this message so badly needed in our community? It starts with me! The real question is whether I will choose to align my life with this love. Will I turn my life towards Love? Will I spond when Love invites? Will my relationship with the God who loves first become the foundation of all I do and am? Love hopes in the other, has faith in the other's goodness. Faith is both the response to love and the means by which our capacity to receive love expands; faith flowers into hope. Hope flows from faith in God, enabling us to express love creatively, drawing what seems lifeless into being. But without love, faith and hope have no being. 



#### The blessing of St. Blaise

Catholics around the world celebrate many of the same God-inspired devotional acts, practices and rituals handed down through the centuries by Holy Mother Church.

Such a devotion is the optional memorial celebrating St. Blaise and the blessing of throats every Feb. 3 There are few facts known about St. Blaise except that he was a fourth-century bishop in the city of Sebaste, Western Armenia, and died as a martyr. A physician, he was regarded as a righteous man and, at an early age, elected bishop by the citizens of Sebaste.

Among the many stories told about the saint, the one for which he is most known, occurred when a mother pleaded for Blaise to cure her son who was dying from a fish bone lodged in his throat. Blaise prayed over the boy, and the child was healed.

### The Blessing of Throats will take place tomorrow at 10am Mass.

It was agreed that even though the Feast of St. Blaise is today that it was more feasible to have the blessing Monday morning



At the close of Catholic School week I came across this letter by Abraham Lincoln, 1809—1865, written to Headmaster of the school his son was attending:

"He will have to learn, I know, that all men are not just and are not true. But teach him if you can the wonder of books, but also give

him quiet time to ponder the eternal mystery of birds in the sky, bees in the sun and flowers on a green hillside. In school teach him it is far more honourable to fail than to cheat. Teach him to have faith in his own ideas, even if everyone tells him he is wrong. Teach him to be gentle with gentle people and tough with the tough. Try to give my son the strength not to follow the crowd when everyone is getting on the bandwagon.

Teach him to listen to all men, but teach him also to filter all he hears on a screen of truth and take the good that comes through.

Teach him if you can, to laugh when he is sad and teach him that there is no shame in tears and teach him to scoff at cynics and to be ware of too much sweetness.

Teach him to sell his brawn and brains to the highest hidders, but power put a price on his heart and soul.

bidders, but never put a price on his heart and soul. Teach him to close his ears to a howling mob and stand and fight if thinks he is right.

Teach him gently, but do not cuddle him, because only the test of fire makes fine steel. Let him have the courage to be impatient—let him have the patience to be brave. Teach him always to have sublime faith in himself because then

he will have faith in humankind.

This is a big order but see what you can do. He is such a fine little fellow, my son"

I wonder if this has relevance for today! What do you think?

A small boy riding a bus home after a school mass was very proud of the card he had received. It had a picture and a caption that read, Have Faith in God. Then to his dismay the card slipped from his hand and fluttered out the window. "Stop the bus!" he cried. "I ve lost my faith in God! "The driver pulled the bus to a stop, and, as the lad climbed out and went to retrieve his card, one of the adult passengers smiled and made a comment about the innocence of youth. A more perceptive adult observed, "All of us would be better off if we were that concerned about our faith."


