Friday 2nd November, Feast of the Holy Souls, begins a month long remembrance of all who begins a month long remembrance of all wh have died. Envelopes are available from the Church, Sacristy, Office or Shop in which the

names of all deceased are entered. The names of all entered are remembered at all Masses during November and on the 1st Fridays during the year. Return the envelopes as soon as possible to the Sacristy, shop or office or in the safe available at the door entrance to the shop.



And again the November Garden of Remembrance will be erected at the Sacred Heart Altar. Cards will be available for names of deceased to be placed on the "Tree of Remembrance". Please do not leave envelopes with money included in the garden. You are free to place plants or flowers of your choice.

Indulgences for the Holy Souls: From 12 noon on 1st Nov. to midnight 2nd Nov. A plenary indulgence can be gained for the Holy Souls by attending a church, going to confession and Holy Communion and praying for the Pope's intentions. Confessions can be made one week before or one week after 2nd November. A Plenary Indulgence may also be obtained once per day for the faithful departed from 1st to 8th November by visiting a cemetery and praying for the dead. A simple prayer for the Holy Souls for November:

Crucified Lord Jesus, have mercy on the souls in **Purgatory.**

parish e.g. funerals, times of masses, prayers, meditations etc. If anyone wants it done and can't, like me, Frank has very kindly offered to do so.

Thank you for all the spectacles being donated for the project in Kolkata in India. The opticians who are going there in November will put them to very good us as there is a big problem with eye conditions there. If anyone else who maybe missed the request for this project last week has time to look up their old glasses and bring to the parish office or shop. Kay Lee came to show us a DVD that was made during the summer regarding Fr Bala's parish mission in India. She spoke of the various needs of his parish, e.g. church, education, training and work for the people. Fr Bala has got 20 sewing machines for the women. This project will enable the women to generate an income through this work. It is hoped to get the young men involved in training for carpentry, electrics, plumbing and other trades or skills. These projects have been supported and funded through the generosity of the people from this parish, prayer groups and groups from outside the parish also. Fr Bala has been assigned to a new parish since last year which has not yet got a church. Kay brought a log book and invited anyone wishing to enter their name and give a donation for the proposed building of this church, and Fr Bala has assured us that the list of names will be put into the foundations of the church. The log book will be available in the club for the next few weeks for anyone wishing to write their name in it or give a donation.

Next week we look forward to "Localise" who are coming with some more tricks and treats up their magic sleeves. Those young people are amazing and do such good work. Thank you Frank for setting up the DVD for us, you are always so helpful and obliging, also Stephen, Martin, Collette and Joan. Until next week, take care Kathleen R
