At wakes, we often hear someone comment that all the flowers around the room might better have been sent to people while they are living, and it's very true. But we might say the same of the Mass cards. It hit me at a

family funeral some time ago how many Mass cards were received for the deceased. It was great to get messages of support and prayers during this time but since then it has been a habit of my husband and myself, to make the effort to have Masses offered for the living! I think of it as our simple act of Mercy. So we have tried to always give perpetual Mass cards to parents of a newborn (family, friends or neighbours) - to let them know that throughout their child's life, he or she will be remembered at Masses. We send smaller, one-year cards to people who are facing hard times illness or difficulties in marriage or employment; it lets them know that we are "with them", thinking of them and that we are praying for them. We get one-year cards as a sign of optimism - a hope (and belief) that in twelve-months, their situation will be very different. We have Masses offered at local parishes for friends who are undergoing surgery, and when we give them the card we let them know that the community is supporting and remembering them through prayer. Whether they go to mass or not it always seems to mean a lot. The Mass is the most powerful prayer in which we can participate for each other, it is a profound act of mercy, whatever the year.
