As many of you know, May to September is my favourite time of the year, the long days and the bright weather cheers me up. I think that's why we traditionally have processions at this time of the year. It is also the time of year for First Communions, secondary school graduations and our annual parish Lourdes pilgrimage. This year's pilgrimage commences next Saturday 12th May led by Fr. Shán O'Cuív. They will be praying for us and we will pray for them. There is a certain sadness that the late Padraig Doyle, parish leader of the pilgrimage for so many years, will not be present. We commend him to the protection of Saint Bernadette and Our Blessed Lady.

Saint Joseph's Boys School Confirmation took place on Tuesday 1st May. In his



homily, Monsignor Dan O' Connor encouraged the boys to use the gifts of the Holy Spirit to make a difference in their own lives and to be the light of Christ to all. In our part of the world the month of May is when most of our younger parishioners receive the Body of Christ for the first time. We keep all those who are preparing for the Sacraments in our prayers.


