

Today's Gospel begins as Jesus and His disciples return home to his native place. On the Sabbath, Jesus went to the synagogue and He began to teach.



How had Jesus become so knowledgeable and such a powerful speaker? He was the son of a carpenter, not the son of a rabbi. Many people in his hometown discounted Jesus and His message. They refused to listen to Him. After all, who did Jesus think He was to preach to the people who had known Him from birth?

Jesus did not get angry. Rather, Jesus replied to their comments by saying that typically a prophet is not honoured by the people who have known him from birth. Jesus realized that He simply was too familiar to them. They only saw in Him what they wanted to see. Thus Jesus was unable to perform any great deeds there as they did not have faith in Him.





Last week I met a woman who said: "I am really sorry I don't seem to be able to pray any more. I have three children under the age of four and my husband and I struggle to make ends meet. We have to work whenever we can. My mother is sick a lot of the time and whatever time I have left over is spent caring for her. I am really sorry, but God doesn't get much of a 'look in' in my life nowadays."

Background, History & Story There are socieral biographies of him. The oldest texts which refer to him are an 8th century necrology at Warzburg and the notice by Hrabases blourus in his martyrology. The name has several variations in spelling (e.g. Chilian, Kilian, Calon, Kilian, Ia treband, the preferred spelling is Cilian, the name appears thus in the hish Iturgical calendar.

d Killian (or alternatively Irish: Cillinn), was an Irish a

Originally in born in ireland in the 7th century, St Kilian had a major role in the growth of Wurzburg into a city, as his rediscovered remains became a point of pilgrimage to the settlement. St Kilian is the patron samt of Würzburg and the Würzburg Cathedral is dedicated to him. St Kilian settled in this part of Franconia in the middle of the 7th century and started preaching his message of Christianity.

He managed to convert the local ruler, Count Gosbert, but mixed himself too far into mantal (and political) matters. In the Franconian area it was customary for a widow to be remarised to the brother of her dead hashand, so that she cou be cared for and this is what Gosbert and his sister in law had done in the part. However, this apparently didi't agree with Christian teachings of the time and St Kilian told Gosbert that he had to ceparate from his fermer sister-in-law. Th c. The irate Countess Gailana waited until her husband was off on a military campaign and ordered the assassination of the troublesome missionaries, who were stabbed while praying and whose bodies were then buried in the count's stables

However, at least according to official Catholic records, the Counters went mad and died, the murderer committed sucide; and Gobbert was also later killed. Following that the local population may have decided that it was a wise move to convert from their add beliefs. Around 70 years later the bones were reduccovered. Supposedly, horses would paw at the ground in the stables in a particular place and, when the area was excavated, three skeletons were discovered

The Feast Day of St tillian is on July 8 and the bones (which ore kept in o crypt in the Neumäinster) are paraded through the streets of the city. According to the local farmers' admanac St Killian's Day is also the start of the harvest time - "Killian, the holy main, marks the first days of cutting" (2 rhymes in Germoni).

The Hillani-Volksfest is one of the biggest festivals in Franconia, with rides, stands, proces beer tents and is held over a fortnight around St Kilkan's Oay)

Patronage St. Kilian is one of the patron saints for sufferers of rheamatism. He is the patron saint of the parish of Tuosist, ever Kennare in County Kerry, where he is believed to have resided before travelling to Germany. A church and holy well are named after him and his feast day, July B, is traditionally celebrated with a

pottern when crowds visit the well for prayers, followed by evening social events. He is also the patron saint of Paderborn, Germany. ography - Killian is usually portrayed, as in his statue at Wilr:burg, bearing

a hishop's mitre and wielding a sword
