

WAKE UP TIME

We are now in the second week of Advent. Normally there are four weeks in Advent, but this year, there are only three full weeks and two days in the fourth week. So it is Wake Up time! Advent is a time for waiting, preparing and repairing.

John the Baptist is our model in all this. He enters the scene in today's Gospel, calling for people to prepare for the coming of the Saviour. "The Word of God came to John in the wilderness." Notice how it by-passed the




John borrows roadwork imagery from the prophet Isaiah, who speaks of flattening mountains, filling in valleys, straightening crooked ways and smoothing rough roads in order to make a passage for the King. He speaks of heavy roadworks ahead; u-bends to be straightened and detours to be navigated. What he is referring to is the landscape of the human heart with its own mountainous regions of anger, deep valleys of grief, crooked ways of deceit, twisted turns of injustice and cul-de-sacs of inhumanity.

Our task during these remaining weeks of Advent is to prepare our own hearts for the coming of the Christ

Amidst the noise and confusion of shopping and spending, let us take a quiet moment, so that God may catch us. In his poem Having Confessed, Patrick Kavanagh says God cannot catch us, unless we stay in the unconscious room of our hearts. So let us take quiet time and like John, let the Word of God come to us. Let us not forget the real focus of Advent, the hidden presence of Jesus in his mother's womb. Sr. Anne
