The Old Testament and the New

A superficial reading of the Old Testament might lead us to believe that it is dangerous!!

The Old Testament seems to present us with a God of wrath while in the New Testament

we encounter a God of mercy. The God of wrath is a vengeful, angry God who orders his chosen people - the Jews - to wage ruthless war on their pagan neighbours and wipe them out. Not much love of neighbour there or even love of enemies for that matter. But things are not as they first seem on a superficial reading. We need to take into account the deeper significance of what we read and its historical and cultural context.

2000 years before Christ, the people of the known world were polytheists - they worshipped many gods and in most cases the greatest of the pagan gods was the sun or a god connected with the sun. The Jews were the first monotheists - they worshipped only one God and for them He was the one true God. The early books of the Old Testament can be confusing sometimes, some facts are hard to believe in and seem rather bygone. We have to understand that the Jewish writers did not know the things we know, they did not fully understand God as we do now and Jesus had not yet come to them to help them see that God loves everyone and wants to save all people. These writers were on a journey of discovery and it is only in the later books of the Old Testament that the penny finally drops. The prophet Isiah was the greatest of these later writers and he had the clearest understanding that the Messiah would come among them to serve and to teach them how to fully love God and their neighbour as themselves.

We live in a world that is torn apart by war, hatred and violence. We pray that we will come to a better understanding of God's answer to the world's problems - to treat others as we ourselves would like to be treated, to forgive others for their sins against us and to fight evil by doing good.

CIARAN CARR FOUNDATION

Family Fun, 5 K in Corkagh Park was held in glorious sunshine last Sunday. Young and old alike, some ran, some walked, while others pushed babies in buggies, some carried babies, and many brought their dogs for the walk. It was a most enjoyable event, thanks to Gemma Carr and her team in the Ciaran Carr Foundation.

(On January 20th 2012 Ciarán Carr, two months off his 21st birthday, collapsed while training with Round Towers Senior Football team.)

Despite the best efforts of his teammates, coaches and the emergency services Ciarán died in Tallaght Hospital shortly after arrival. His death was attributed to what is commonly known as Sudden Adult Death Syndrome (SADS). Ciarán's death shocked his club, the Clondalkin community and the public at large.

Gemma and Philip Carr, along with friends and family, began to put together a plan to ensure that such an incident never happened again within Round Tower GAA Club. Gradually this developed into the Ciarán Carr Foundation, a charity committed to preventing sudden cardiac death in our community and others who are willing to work alongside us.

On Thursday April 4th 2013, the Ciarán Carr Foundation was officially launched in Croke Park by the Dublin Senior Football manager Jim Gavin with Gemma and Philip Carr.
