It is hard to believe that the World Meeting of Families is already two weeks ago. The week itself seemed to fly by. I found it hard to fully understand what I experienced and witnessed as it was happening. But a week away from the parish to reconnect with family and friends helped to make some kind of sense to it.

I think it is fair enough to say that the week that was built up to be a celebration of families was overshadowed by the revelations of the historic scandals in elements of the Church in Pennsylvania. Many people, including myself are very angry and saddened by the reports and the wounds it reopened. But, I am not someone that gives up lightly when things get difficult or challenging. Anger, with hope, can be a powerful

force. I am trying to use these challenges to make a difference in the parish community, with my friends and with my family.

I firmly believe we the baptized are the Church of Jesus Christ - a community of faith, a family of love built and guided by the unconditional love of Christ. It is true that the institution has failed many and we must acknowledge and change this, but we must also not overlook that in so many ways and at so many times We Are The Body of

Christ. As such, if one part suffers, we all suffer. If one hurts, we all hurt. If one is happy, we all experience that happiness. With this in mind I am trying to look at the WMoF from a different angle. Overall numbers weren't what we had hoped for and questions need to be asked but what is the legacy for us, here, in the parish of Clondalkin? What will your lasting memories be? Will they be happy memories and experiences such as the KISI's as you witnessed their energy, their joy in and love for Jesus

Christ? I hope you will remember what we have achieved as a parish community. We hosted over 100 of them in the parish school. You donated sleeping bags, others hosted pilgrims and donated rooms, and others donated their time



and talents to care and cook for them. I hope you remember our hospitality as we

welcomed them and countless other visitors during the week from all corners of the Earth... Did you know that many of our young Altar Servers served at the masses in the RDS and Phoenix Park? Maybe you volunteered for the WMoF? Whatever role you played, whatever your highpoints and memories were, I encourage you to

remember that moment and reconnect with it. In so many beautiful

ways, despite our flaws and short comings as a Church, we showed so practically WE ARE CHURCH ... and it was inspiring! It's still all sinking in! Christina Malone, PPW

Morning: In the Church 10.45 to 11.45am.


Evening: In the Church—Hour of Prayer—later than normal timing (possibly 8.20pm, following on First Holy Communion Meeting in Church). All welcome.



This photo from September 1979 holds happy memories for Clondalkin. The Cross was made by Fisher Metal Fabrication Ltd. at their premises on the Old Nangor Road. It is made of 316 quality stainless steel. It was relocated to a roadside location at Tullyeskar on the R132 near Drogheda where it is mounted on a concrete plinth and has become a shrine where visitors pray and leave flowers. It cost €25K of which €13K was raised locally and was unveiled on the 29th September by the late Cardinal Tomas O'Fiaich.

The Pope held a service there in 1979 with 300000 in attendance. We pray that in years to come people will share their many fond memories of Pope Francis' visit. Thanks to Tommy Keogh for photo and information. Teresa

The Tree of Hope may help to focus on how fragile life is and to pray for those in difficulty. Frank also told us of the Special Prayer a day in September which is dedicated for our children & grandchildren. There is a special prayer for each day. Leaflets are available in the church and there was a big uptake on them over the weekend. The Health and Wellbeing Week starts Monday 10 to 16 September with a wide range of activities happening throughout South County Dublin. There are activities for every age from children to seniors citizens. There are booklets available with the various activities, times and locations listed. However, the only thing I could see was the Blood Pressure Checks in Clondalkin Library which is free of charge. Worth getting done. We finished off the morning with a little music and sing song. Noel played a lovely selection of popular tunes on his whistle and harmonica accompanied by all the singers. Maureen sang her "Feathers and Hula Hula" skirt. "Thank You " Collette, Stephen, Martin, Noel and you all for making the morning so enjoyable. Next week we will have some more music and song with Timpeall na Tithe and hopefully Fr Bala will be present before his takes his leave of us. Turning Faith Into Action 🚽

Our biggest obstacle to a revival of faith in Ireland today is the system of parish life we have grown up in. This is not a model that has ever invited most Mass-goers into a serious mode of participation.

Turning faith into action is what it means to be a missionary disciple. Many people can be put off by the phrase "missionary disciple". Part of this has to do with the language – which can seem alien in a Catholic envi-



ronment – but it's also partly that most people have never been asked to talk about it. Often, when you ask someone to discuss how they live out their faith in the small, everyday ways, you will find that they are already living as a missionary disciple. I have been struck recently by a number of parishes who really wanted to see where they were going as a parish. These groups invited along parishioners to be part of the process. When this group gets together, invariably the question asked is "why

this?" The truth is that parish councils would not usually be in the headspace for this kind of work and so these groups have to bypass the council. You can see how, in these instances, there is a problem with communication and vision. But the very fact that there are parishes out there who are thinking outside the box and trying to engage parishioners in the process of moving into mission gives me great hope for the Irish parish of tomorrow. ••••••
