MERCY SUNDAY AND THE CANONISATION OF TWO POPES

On Sunday next 27th April, Sunday of Divine Mercy Blessed John XXIII and Blessed John Paul II will be canonised by Pope Francis in Saint Peter's Square in Rome.

The first miracle attributed to **Saint John Paul II**, which led to his beatification, concerned the healing of a French nun who recovered from Parkinson's disease in 2005. Sister Marie Simon-Pierre had said that her illness suddenly vanished when her order started praying on her behalf. A second miracle involved a Costa Rican woman who was cured of a cerebral aneurysm the very day of John Paul II's beatification.

Blessed John XXIII was pope from 1958 to 1963 and convened the Second Vatican Council. The first miracle attributed to him is the healing of an ailing nun of stomach ulcers in 1966, three years after his death. Pope Francis took the rare step of waiving the requirement of a second miracle, paving the way for his imminent canonisation.



EASTER 2014

During the week some younger parishioners put this question to me. Why does Easter change every year? Knowing only too well what the real question was I replied that Easter doesn't change every year only the date is different, caused the original question to be repeated but phrased a different way. Why does the date of Easter change every year? Easter occurs on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the vernal equinox which this year is the 20th April. You might like to keep this newsletter in case reasoning behind the date of Easter comes up in a quiz.) This reflects the occasion of the first Easter. It was the time of the Jewish feast of Passover-the time of liberation which was well remembered by shepherds of the desert-because the gentle but clear light of the full moon at night provided a very suitable time for the herding of sheep to pastures new.

The symbol of light is an appropriate one for Easter. On Holy Saturday night we light and bless the paschal candle lit from the Easter fire. As we take our lights from the candle and chant 'Christ our Light' we recall Christ's victory over darkness. The church becomes brighter as the number of lighted candles multiplies and we join with newly baptised and confirmed Christians throughout the world who add to the growing number of believers. The work of Easter doesn't stop today. Rather, it is the beginning of fifty glorious days towards Pentecost.

A big thank you to all who used their gifts and talents during the season of Lent, Holy Week and the Triduum. A particular welcome to visitors and those living overseas who are with us this Easter.
