law and they were astute enough to see that the organised law of the land was far better than the chaotic law of the Jungle. This is the gift Rome gave our contemporary civilisation, the idea that the rule of law should prevail over brute force. Might is not right- justice and fairness are important. An accused man must have his side of the story heard before condemning him.

Rome had a dark underbelly of corruption, which eventually was its downfall.

Why did St. Peter and St Paul make Rome the headquarters of Christianity? Three ingredients were needed for a social environment that Christianity could thrive in.

- 1 It needed respect for law and order as Rome had
- 2 It needed respect for culture and learning as the Greeks had in Athens
- 3 It needed a living faith in what God has revealed which up to now had been based in Jerusalem.

But Jerusalem was a small, peripheral city so that was why the Apostles moved their headquarters to Rome, the centre of the Ancient world. This is how Christianity came to Rome and it has been there ever since through all the ups and downs and upheavals of history. Its heritage came from Jerusalem and Athens but its physical base was and is in Rome.



ROMAN IN ROMAN CATHOLICISM

Why are we Roman Catholics? Where did the Rome in Roman Catholicism come from? Jesus the Messiah did his works of redemption in Israel, which was then a colony of the Roman Empire. On Ascension Thursday he gave the great commission to his Apostles – go out and convert the whole world Baptising them in the name of the Father, the Son, and Holy Spirit. After Pentecost the Apostles began to do this with great success.

When St. Paul arrived on the scene after his conversion he spread the new religion of Christianity far beyond its original borders up into Syria, Turkey and Greece. It was at this stage that St. Peter and St. Paul made the momentous decision to anchor Christianity in Rome - it now had it head- quarters in the capital of the Empire and not in Jerusalem where it originally started.

Why Rome? It is said that if you want to make your mark in the world today you must do it in New York. Rome was the New York of the ancient world and there is no doubt about that, by the standards of the world at that time, Rome was great. Its massive empire extended an influence far beyond the city itself and that influence is still with us today. The fact that the Empire lasted as long as it did, was as big as what it was, and left such a profound legacy are pointers to its greatness. Of course it had a dark side and corruption was there too in the midst of it greatness.

What made the Romans great was their talent for pragmatic organisation and their respect of law and order. In their heyday they were a family oriented society who valued the ordering of society through good government. They gave a considerable amount of self-rule to their colonies and as long they didn't rebel the Romans left them alone to organise their own affairs. They were great road builders and this was one of the reasons why St. Paul travelled far and wide on his missionary journeys

Out of the Roman talent for administration grew Roman (Continued on page 4)
