No 32 **BASED ON FAITH!** 95% of what we know is based on faith, so said St. Augustine. Some modern academics may dispute figure but there is no denying that most of what we know is based on faith, what we hear from other people or what we read in

books. Even scientific theories which are supposed to be rigorously tested and scrutinised before being proved follow this principal.

In fact most human theories including those of science end up being discarded and discredited. We live by faith and not by sight as St. Paul says and this applies not just in our religion but also in the material realm. It is impossible to prove the correctness of everything we hear – most of the time in our own everyday lives we trust the people who tell us things. When my friend tells me he will give me a lift in his car I don't tell him to prove to me that he can drive. I don't ask to see his driving licence. I wouldn't have many friends left if I did this

So it is with our faith – it is the Pearl of great price and the foundation of the spiritual life. It gives back what we put into it if we are passionate about it in the right way. However if we only dabble at it in a half hearted way we will inevitably be distracted by the material things of the world and faith will wither away.

Those of our community who come to Mass regularly are treating their faith as the Pearl of great price and are giving priority to the spiritual over the material. Material things are not bad and we need them in order to live life effectively but they are a secondary good.

The trouble arises when we make then the pearl of great price and we become over preoccupied with them and so we lose sight of what is lasting and eternal.
