ADULT CATECHISM STUDIES

The Adult Studies group of the Catechism is due to resume their studies on Wednesday 2nd September. This will be Unit 2 of the course which covers The Creed, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit.

During our Annual National Gathering in Maynooth a former Catechism student who had completed the course outlined the great spiritual benefits which she believed had accrued for her family and community from involvement in the studies. Indeed, the challenges highlighted in the talk on Evangelisation at the conference will encourage the studies group to seek further enlightenment from the Catechism and to help us we hope to assist in the New Evangelisation.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church makes it clear that all its members are by virtue of Baptism called to witness to the living presence of Jesus Christ to others, and to proclaim a message of hope and salvation. It has also become clear in recent years that there is an urgent necessity for presenting this message of salvation, not only to a non-believing world, but also to many baptised members of the church, who, for all manner of reasons, have never been able to experience the loving presence of Jesus Christ in their own personal lives.
