Advent & Christmas can pass by many of us and we have little time for the main event and people of the mystery. Or we can hit it in spots. It's so busy and often with very worthwhile events for the family. So the four weeks we begin today can ensure we don't miss it. There is an urgency in our Scriptures today. They invite us to a spiritual tune-up at the start of our new liturgical year. They invite us to wait for our King who is to come...

Waiting. We're not very good at that anymore. Maybe we never were. We get frustrated if we have to wait for any length of time. Waiting feels like time wasted and who can afford to waste time these days? But maybe a little waiting is a good thing. We spend a fair amount of time teaching our children how to wait -"No, you can't have sweets just before dinner". So, we already know that there are benefits to waiting. What if we changed our thinking about waiting - Waiting then becomes an activity, and a pretty helpful one at that. Waiting reminds us that we are not the centre of the universe; that God is in control, that life I a gift and that the present matters. By actively waiting, we are able to reflect more carefully on what really matters during Advent. By actively waiting, we are preparing our hearts for Jesus to be born anew in them and delightfully surprise us.

So what/Who are we waiting for? Throughout the Mass today and every Mass we hear marks of the Kingdom of Jesus - holiness, justice, reconciliation and more. This is the type of people we are called to be. He is the King who embodies the qualities of the Kingdom. He calls us to be like him – no more, no less. He will be the friend, our accompaniment in the worst of times. Jesus is the one **Knockmitten** who has shared all our lives. People could watch him and say that things couldn't get much worse for him, born in a borrowed bed with crucifixion ahead of him. We may expect that our leaders will share the difficult times with us. Jesus promises little except peace, truth, compassion and love. His followers will not be the powerful ones of the city nor of the country. Like Him they will be men and women for others. And love is their power!!

This *advent* realise that the Jesus we wait for works from the inside out, from people's goodness and love; not from any constitution from on high. Any reforms of the church like the reforms needed at the moment - church and abuse, church and education, true collaboration, ... - means a renewal from the inside out. Media will not renew the church, leaders cannot renew parishes, unless we find Christ at the centre of prayer, life, works and ministry. The renewal starts with me, in my waiting.

So, as we begin our Advent Journey, remember that the God who loves you deeply is waiting with open arms for you to open the doors of your heart and be open to being surprised.

CONNECTING THE PARISH AND YOUNG PEOPLE

As the Pope John Paul II Award welcomes its twelfth year of participants, it is vital to reflect on the opportunities the Award creates. Starting in 2006 in the Diocese of Derry, the Award was spearheaded by Fr. Paul Farren, Director of the Derry Diocesan Catechetical Centre. The Award quickly established itself in several schools in the diocese. Since then, it has flourished throughout Ireland and Britain. Now running in 23 dioceses in Ireland and two in Britain, dioceses recognise the potential of the Award to engage 16 - 18 year olds in their faith at a critical juncture in their lives.



The Pope John Paul II Award is a faith achievement award for young people between the age of 16 and 18. It is non-competitive, inclusive, flexible and voluntary.

It enables participants to take an active part in the life of their Church - in the

life of their community and society. It enables young people become more aware of the teaching and role of the Catholic Church in the world and to engage at a deep level with Christ.

From the outset, the vision of the Award was clear - to recognise and empower young people to be actively involved in their parish and community. With over 3,500 now enrolling each year and over 25,000 having completed the Award since 2006, the energy generated by the Award is easily discernible.


