

What's in a name?

In today's Gospel we hear Jesus ask a question - 'Who do people say that I am?' The disciples gave various answers but He makes the question more direct, "Who do YOU say that I am?" We live in an age of immediate communication and social media, an age where there is great pressure to be what others think we should be. There is pressure on our youth to live up to unattainable images of body types, fashions and ideals and in this, identity can be lost. It seems that individuals and communities are becoming more and more faceless as the focus is on the anonymous individual to be something they can never be. But we are a community, a family of faith. We celebrate the uniqueness and beauty of the individual, created and unconditionally loved by God - "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, ... I loved you" - And as a community of faith we are to be known by our love, compassion, caring and support not because

it's a good thing to do but because, as Christians, that is who we are! This is our identity. As St Paul says, 'Where there is love, there is God... God is Love.

So what's in a name? - To answer Jesus' question truly for ourselves compels a response from us. To truly know who Jesus is, to truly know His name compels us to be love, to be compassion for others. To care and be love for others is to make sure that no one in our community is isolated, anonymous, faceless or nameless. My father once told me that a person dies twice - when we physically die and secondly when our name is spoken by someone for the last time. Each person's story matters, each name matters.





On Monday last, World Suicide Prevention Day, I had

the privilege of being involved in two very memorable and moving events as our community in Clondalkin showed an outpouring of solidarity and support, remembering people whom we have lost through suicide

and those who have


been left behind. There was the planting of the Tree of Hope at the side of our Church and later that evening the placing of names of those lost through suicide,

written on hearts, in the Remembrance Garden in Rowlagh. Each event sought to give a place for people to remember their loved ones lost through suicide and to be a beacon of support in a community for those who suffer with depression & mental health issues. The trellis of hearts stands as a powerful symbol of

the lives, stories and names behind each heart and to a community that cares so deeply. So, as a community of faith, let us be love in all that we say and do.

Engaging Young People in a Parish

The Junior Parish Pastoral Council (J.P.P.C) began back in 2006 and has been going strong ever since. The council started as a way of giving young people a voice in their parish. It is for secondary school students, and consists of pupils from all four secondary schools in our area, and pupils from our neighbouring parish Kilbeggan. There is a committee consisting of Chair, Vice Chair and a Secretary. The selection of the commit-



tee has varied over the years, the most common being an interview process. The J.P.P.C has the full support of the Parish team and the P.P.C.

Over the years the Council has achieved many things and gone many places, enriching the teens' faith and leading them to a personal relationship with Jesus. The secret to the success of the J.P.P.C is to be missional, to be constantly looking at what it is that we can do as a community – always helping others – and to be fully immersed in prayer. All members of the

council are actively involved in keeping things fresh and exciting. To start a Junior Parish Pastoral Council all that is needed is young people, adult volunteers and the support of their Parish Priest. Our J.P.P.C meet weekly during the school year but every parish is different. It is a great idea for getting young people involved in their local parish, and comes highly recommended.


