in the Gospel today, when Jesus told this story, I often wonder if it hit its intended targets. The Pharisees thought they were the upper crust in God's kingdom. They were the most religious, pious and holy people they knew, and if anyone deserved places at God's table, certainly it was them - at least in their minds. They had developed an attitude of distinction - a

culture of exclusion. But in this Gospel reading, Jesus says, "Not so fast, folks! There are other guests who are just as important as you. They might not look religious or come to mass every Sunday, and they might not have all the right table manners or be the right age, and they might not wear the best clothes or live in the best parts of the city, but I've invited them to the banquet as well." When we, like the Pharisees, think that we have a special place in God's family because of something we've done, or the particular theory we embrace, or because in our own minds we belong to the right kind of church, Jesus says, "Guess what? These other guests of mine are just as important as you are, as loved as you are, as welcome as you are." The Good News - That we are loved unconditionally, that we are loveable (even when we don't believe it) and that we can share that love with others - is for all. To make it more challenging – we are called to the bearers and carriers of this invitation, through our lives, our outreach, our mission, our Baptism and our faith.

The culture we live in is very good at producing popular trends. We call it 'the in thing'. It seems to be increasingly the 'in thing' to be so focused on ourselves and our own needs that we don't see the bigger picture and how we can meet the needs of others. It's the 'in thing' to focus in on ourselves and not the Other. It's the 'in thing' to even enshrine this focus as gospel in our practices, structures and behaviours – even as a church or parish community. So who do we exclude – intentionally or otherwise? Where is our invite conditional? When are we making His invite known from Sunday to Sunday to those who might never have heard it or experienced it?

It is fitting that today is the anniversary, in 1963, of Martin Luther King's inspiring *I have a* dream speech made while addressing a civil rights march at Lincoln Memorial in Washington. If you have never heard it or heard just bits, it's well worth looking up on youtube. Maybe reflect on this short excerpt during the week and ask how is my faith, my invite and my actions making the Good News of Jesus an ever present reality in our community?

I have a dream today. I have a dream that one day every valley shall be exalted, every hill and mountain shall be made low, the rough places will be made plain, and the crooked places will be made straight, and the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together.

This is our hope. This is the faith that I go back to the South with. With this faith we will be able to hew out of the mountain of despair a stone of hope. With this faith we will be able to transform the jangling discords of our nation into a beautiful symphony of brotherhood. With this faith we will be able to work together, to pray together, to struggle together, to go to jail together, to stand up for freedom Frank Brown PPW together, knowing that we will be free one day.
