EXPLORING THE MASS - LITURGY OF THE WORD

We have learned that the Mass has four distinct parts, (1) Introduction – coming together of the assembly (2) Liturgy of the Word (3) Liturgy of the Eucharist (4) Concluding Rite.

We have dealt with two parts and we now concentrate on Liturgy of the Word. The Liturgy consists:

- 1. Reading from the Old and New Testament and the Acts of the Apostles. To emphasise the presence of God in the Word the readings take place from a designated area that is used only for this purpose, we call the Ambo. The Word is read slowly and clearly ending with a pause and then "The Word of the Lord". The Assembly listens and to facilitate this "listening" it is recommended the discarding of the Mass leaflets.
- 2. Recitation of the Psalms the Psalms would have been familiar and prayed by Christ. The word "Response" is not a part of the psalms and is not used
- 3. Creed signifying the response of the assembly to the "Word"
- 4. Prayers of the Faithful the assembly intercedes for all humanity, the church worldwide and those who have died. The priest gathers up these petitions and presents them to God.

Many of the recommendations will come into effect in the near future.

FR PADRAIG SHARES QUESTIONS PEOPLE ASK

- Q. I am puzzled that the Gospel at the start of Advent is about the end of the world. What has this to do with preparation for Christmas?
- A. Advent is a season preparing for the coming of Christ. The first focus of Advent is on the future coming of Christ, that is, at the end of each person's life. The Church's liturgical year begins by reminding us where the journey of life will finish. Our lives began with God our Creator and will return to God. It's like the line of a circle which ends precisely where it began. As Advent advances the liturgy taps into the spirituality of the Jewish people awaiting the Messiah. The last week before Christmas brings us to the people who would be associated with the birth of Jesus.
- Q. Why should we pray for our dead? If they are in heaven they don't need our prayers, and if they are in hell, there is no redemption.
- A. You are missing the consoling doctrine of purgatory, the purifying transition from earthly imperfections to divine glory. The mercy of God grants this process of purification to all who die in God's grace but are not yet perfectly reflecting the holiness and glory of God. As members of the one body of Christ, we assist one another by prayers, personal sacrifices and acts of charity.
