

WORLD DAY OF THE SICK, FEASTDAY OF OUR LADY OF LOURDES

Last week we celebrated World Day of the sick, feast day of Our Lady of Lourdes. It all began in 1858 and at that time Lourdes was just another rural town in Southern France. It was nothing out of the ordinary, a place on the margins, well off the beaten track. France at that time had gone through 50 years of unimaginable upheaval. The revolution of 1790 had completely overturned the political, cultural and social order. During the infamous "Reign of Terror" countless thousands of innocent people died at the guillotine.

The revolution degenerated into chaos and it was only when Napoleon came to power that some sort of order was restored. Napoleon restored order all right but he also engaged in wars of conquest against neighbouring countries. After his eventual defeat in 1815 there was an uneasy peace for a while. Then in 1848 revolution broke out again not only in France but all over Europe. New forms of government which were largely secular and many of them were, to varying degrees, hostile to Christianity.

God is also in the business of revolutions, but God's revolutions are always velvet ones, quiet ones. He started a revolution in Lourdes, a poor backwater using a humble peasant girl. Bernadette Soubirous as his instrument in a time of upheaval and suffering. The manifestation of God's quiet revolution came in the form of Mary, the Mother of God's Son, Jesus. A sceptic would say that what happened in Lourdes is for the naive and the superstitious. It is not in tune with the thinking of a sophisticated rationalist – this simple minded peasant girl imagined it all.

But Christians believe that the Divine and supernatural are never very far from our lives. God can manifest Himself in any way and any place he wants. With Moses he spoke out of a burning bush – with Bernadette He spoke through Mary the Mother of his Son.

So Mary's velvet revolution in Lourdes has grown (Continued on page 4)
