FACTS AND FIGURES

Every parish keeps statistics to send to the diocese. The numbers at our Masses on census day October 13th/14th 2012 were as follows:

7.30pm Sat Vigil - 219, 9.00am - 126, 10.30am - 255, 12.00noon - 345, 5.30pm - 156, Total = 1101

The number for Sacraments were: Communion 190, Confirmation 187, Baptisms 154, Marriages 56 and funerals 80. From that very raw data it seems that there are lots of new parishioners and fewer funerals.

The weekly running cost of the 3 churches and on-going pastoral formation is €2.168. This cost of over €112.000 last year does not include the salaries of the priests of the parish nor the major repairs to the churches. Random examples of expenses includes: Insurance €8,960, Light & Heat €24,609, Altar Supplies €9,066 and Office Expenses €12,820.

The Parish Finance Committee ask you to consider two ideas. Firstly, if you currently don't contribute to parish finances would you give serious thought to making some contribution, even a Euro a week? Secondly, many of our parishioners contribute over €250 per year between family offering and Christmas and Easter Dues. If you are a PAYE tax payer the parish may be able to reclaim some of the tax you have already paid. This is not an extra tax paid by you but a tax relief available to all charities. If you would like further information regarding this please contact the Parish Office.

In conclusion I always make the point that the parish would not be in the healthy financial position it is without the many volunteers, to which I say on your behalf "Muchas Gracias"

GALLERY NEWS

The opening hymn the Gallery choir will sing today is one that is very familiar and we do hope that everyone in the congregation will give voice to this lovely composition. The melody is a traditional air and one that has been admirably set to the words written by St. Patrick in 450AD approx.

The text comes from a poem by St. Patrick which was motivated by adverse circumstances in which he found himself. The Druids commanded by Laoghaire, had laid an ambush in order to prevent St. Patrick from going to the Hill of Tara to preach the Christian faith. Eventually he overcame their opposition and in response for his victory over paganism wrote the text that has become known as St. Patrick's breastplate. There is a depth of feeling and pure expressions of deeply held belief that are conveyed in a musical language that is a joy to read. "Christ be beside me" is only a small part of a long poem that not only draws on the created world to convey, through imagery, the message of the Christian faith but also the belief in God's power to protect and guide.
