WORLD DAY OF MIGRANTS AND REFUGEES

Today we celebrate World Day of Migrants and Refugees, Pope Francis' message to mark the day is based on the theme, "Migrants and Refugees Challenge Us. The Response of the Gospel of Mercy", "at times we are called to gaze even more attentively on mercy so that we may become a more effective sign of the Father's action in our lives."

He points out that migration continues to grow worldwide as more and more refugees are fleeing from their homes. Although this can challenge traditional ways of life, Pope Francis urges people not to take the suffering of others for granted.

"Today, more than in the past," he says, "the Gospel of mercy troubles our consciences." "Migration movements are now a structural reality, and the priority at this time must be to provide programmes which address the causes of migration and the changes it entails, including its effect on the makeup of societies and peoples.

In a desperate plea for justice, Pope Francis reminds us that migrants are our brothers and sisters in search of a better life, one in which poverty, hunger and the unjust distribution of the planet's resources is overcome.
