HEAVY METAL CONVERSION

When I was in secondary school in the 1970's one of the most outrageous and shocking entertainers in the Rock music business was Alice Cooper. He looked and acted like the devil incarnate – black leather gear, straggly black hair, black eye make-up and mascara. His most well known piece of music was "SCHOOLS OUT" which was an anthem for rebellious schoolboys all over the world. Cooper's live performances on stage were designed to shock and they did. Indeed they were so shocking that I won't go into the details in a parish newsletter.

Anyway as always happens with celebrities in the entertainment business they ultimately fade from the scene. Their youthful energy declines, they can't keep up the momentum and all too often their wild lifestyle leads them down the path of addiction to alcohol, drugs and promiscuous sex.

I hadn't heard about Alice Cooper for years and I often wondered what happened to him. In the New Year I had an opportunity to catch up with him in the Catholic media.

Alice Cooper underwent a conversion in the 1980's when he was battling a serious addiction to alcohol. He returned to the Christian Faith of his childhood – his father was a preacher. And found the inner strength to face his demons and overcome his addiction. Cooper continued to perform on stage but reformed his more outrageous antics that gained him such notoriety in the 1970's. Up until recently he lived his Christian faith quietly but with perseverance. In a rare interview given recently in America and published in the Catholic media the former SHOCK ROCKER said the following: "I was one thing at one time and now I am something new. I am a new creation now. Don't judge Alice Cooper by what he used to be. Praise God for what I am now"
