Christians were not subversive however. St. Paul urged them to pay their taxes, to obey the civil authorities and to fight evil by doing good. They would pray for the emperor but they would not pray to the emperor. The growth of the Christian religion and its tenacity alarmed the Emperor Diocletion so he activated the last and most terrible of the persecutions. St Agnes died in this persecution – put to death by the sword for the sake of Christ's Kingdom. So we pray for her intercession today to help all Christians who are still being persecuted in our day

Frank Duff was a civil servant before Ireland got its independence in 1926 and he knew Willam Cosgrave the minister for local Government who gave him the hostel which had been used as an army barracks prior to Irish Independence by the Black and Tans British soldiers. It is believed that the hostel was run by Frank Duff and members of the Saint Vincent De Paul Society in the early years and later on became solely a Legion of Mary hostel run by Legion volunteers.

Christopher Okereke 457 3546 We celebrated the Feast of St. Agnes during the week who was martyred in Rome 300AD in the last great persecution organised by the Emperor Diocletion. It is believed she was only 13 years old when she died and was initially arrested for having refused to marry a pagan man who was insisting on her embracing his religion. Agnes was repeatedly subjected to bribes and threats but she courageously stood her ground for her Christian faith.

During Emperor Diocletion's reign Christianity was well established in Rome and this alarmed the emperor. So he launched the last and most terrible of the persecutions so as to eradicate this strange tenacious religion once and for all. Why did the Romans persecute Christians, after all they were not rebellious or subversive and paid their taxes? Added to this was the fact that the Romans were usually very broadminded about other people's religions so much so that they built the Pantheon as a temple to all the gods of the empire. The Pantheon is the only building of ancient times still standing in central Rome.

Whenever they conquered a particular area the Romans would find out about the local god of the people and pay homage to him or her. This of course placated the newly conquered people and made them less likely to rebel. The Romans were what we would call today "tolerant" and if there was a new god who wasn't a threat to Roman power they honoured him with a place in the Pantheon. But these blooming Christians - they wouldn't honour any god except the one True God. At their Sunday Mass they would say the Gloria prayer as we do today "for you alone are the Holy One, You alone are the Lord, You alone are the most High". This was provocative stuff and the pagan Romans did not like it at all.

Even worse the Christians would not pay to the emperor as a god – they would not engage in Emperor Worship. The early *(Continued on page 4)*
