ST KILLIAN – FEAST DAY 8TH JULY

Not much is known about the Patron Saint of our Parish, St. Killian. What is known is that he was not typical of the Irish monks who had their golden age at that time. He was a missionary more that a monk and he did most of his work in Southern Germany in the region of Bavaria.

Killian was born in the Cavan area around the year 600AD. In Europe it was the era of the Dark Ages but in Southern Germany Christianity was beginning to take root thanks to the efforts of missionary monks like St. Killian. Killian and his companions travelled in a dangerous environment where pagan tribes fought one another for political dominance. Missionary monks evangelised by travelling from village to village unarmed and with only a minimum of provisions for their own use.

In many cases the pagan inhabitants were suspicious of these strange visitors but came to admire their courage and commitment in coming to their communities. Added to this was that these missionaries took the trouble to learn the local language and local customs of the people. The witness they gave to their vows of poverty, celibacy and obedience was also impressive. These tribal communities gradually came to believe that the Christian God that St. Killian and his companions spoke of must be a very powerful God indeed if he chose such good living and gentle men to be his missionaries. They seemed so vulnerable and unprotected and yet the witness they gave was so powerful in word and deed that they won many converts.

In spite of the success the work was dangerous. This was the era of the Dark Ages after the collapse of Rome and tribal wars frequently broke out. St. Killian and two of his German companions were put to death in one such outbreak of violence in 689. Their mortal remains are still venerated in the city of Wurzburg and Killian of course is the patron of our parish in Clondalkin. He was a great

evangeliser in dark and dangerous times and so we pray for his intercession for our community that we will live the light of the Gospel with energy and commitment.
