### HOME AND AWAY

Hearing a Trinidadian accent proclaiming the Word of God at the Requiem Mass of Kathleen Kelly during the week brought back to me many happy memories of that beautiful country. Some of you know that my younger brother Niall has lived there for fifteen years. During my last visit I noticed that the nearest Church to Niall's house, Saint Cecilia, has daily Mass at 5.45am and the next parish Saint Joseph has daily Mass this Lenten season at 6am. Attending Mass in various parts of Trinidad is a very different experience. The most noticeable difference is the whirring of fans giving some relief from the tropical heat and that sense of belonging to a worshiping community. In our own modest way our parish is attempting to create that here. Baptisms, weddings and funerals should be a celebration of the parish community and not an individual experience. Kathleen Kelly and Brendan Flanagan, both of whom died recently, were full, active and involved members of our Parish worshiping community and one got a sense of that from their funeral liturgies.

### CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

Last Wednesday saw the launch of our study of the "Catechism of the Catholic Church". This is a joint initiative with Newcastle Parish and around thirty people attended the opening session. It is a guided study of the Catechism in modular form and if you missed the first night please feel free to come along next Wednesday.
