FRIDAY 5TH APRIL - SUNDAY 7TH APRIL Next Sunday, the First Sunday after Easter is now designated Divine Mercy Sunday.

## POLISH BLESSING OF BREAD

The joy of having people from different countries living in our community is that we sample the best of their traditions and the Polish blessing of bread for Easter ranks among them.

Swieconka (Blessing) is one of the most enduring Polish traditions. Baskets containing a sampling of Easter foods are brought to church to be blessed on Holy Saturday. The basket is traditionally lined with a white linen or lace napkin and decorated with sprigs of boxwood (bukszpan), the typical Easter evergreen. Poles take special pride in preparing a decorative and tasteful basket with crisp linens, occasionally embroidered for the occasion, and just enough boxwood and ribbon woven through the handle.

While in some older or rural communities, the priest visits the home to bless the foods, the vast majority of Poles visit the church on Holy Saturday, once again praying at the Tomb of the Lord.


