



Advent time of new beginnings – preparation

for the first and second coming

Today we are celebrating the first of Advent. In another three weeks we are welcoming the greatest gift of God's love to us. His Son became human and he became one of us.

However we have another three weeks to prepare for this wonderful present. How are we going to use this time between now and then? The Readings and the Gospel during Advent are helping us to prepare for the second coming of Jesus Christ. The second coming – what does that mean exactly? As Catholics we believe and pray every time we gather at Mass that Jesus will come again. For the past two thousand years we have been waiting and probably half forgotten about it. Advent is giving us the great opportunity to reconnect with that thought. Jesus will come back to judge the living and the death. How do we live our life? Are we ready for Jesus? Or would we ask him to come back at a different time? Time pressures us – we all know this too well. How often do we say "we have no time for..." But how do we spend that time. Statistics tell us that the average person throughout their lifetime spends five years waiting in lines and queues and roughly six months of that is waiting at traffic lights. That is a lot of time some would argue wasted time – but again what do we do with the time that is given to us? Do we make the most of it or do we waste time?
