- 1 Take: We take our gifts, bread, wine, money. Vatican 11 recommends that the bread and wine being presented should be sufficient so that all can receive from what is consecrated at the same Mass. This recommendation will be soon taken on board.
- "Blessed are You" from the Jewish table prayers expresses praise for God and creation. The church implores the power of the Holy Spirit to change the gifts offered by human hands to become the Body and Blood of Christ. At the consecration the priest uses the word said by Christ at the Last Supper "This is my Body....This is my Blood...Do this in memory of Me"
- **Break:** the bread is broken and raised for the assembly to see and welcome the Risen Christ in the Host
- 4 Share: going forward to receive symbolises the humble patience of the poor to be fed and the joyful confidence of God's people on the march to the "promised land"

This part of the Mass ends with prayers after the Communion.

The talks conclude with the "Concluding Rite" next Tuesday at 7.30pm in the Pastoral Centre and all are welcome.

Today the Sisters, the successors of those who arrived here in the 1850's still carry the lamp, not only in school ministry but in building up the body of Christ in the greater Clondalkin area.
