THE GOOD SOCIETY!

What is the Good Society? Perhaps nothing has been more controversial and divisive in the history of humanity than this issue. In our fallen world we all too often look to politics to create the good society and fix broken communities. The allure of political power is so strong that it has pulled many into thinking that it is armies, police, lawmakers, financiers and politicians who make the world go round. How often do people in our time yearn for a great political leader who will rid our society of oppression and establish a new social order of prosperity, harmony and national pride? There is nothing new in all this – the Jewish people of biblical times also yearned for a political leader that would rid them of the Roman Imperialists and re-establish national pride as in the golden era of King David's reign. Many Jewish people were disappointed when Jesus seemed to show little interest in politics. He said very little about it but in the little he did say he indicated that of itself politics is good and necessary. Jesus was not a politician but he never condemned it either.

The source of good government is the good person who lives a virtuous life according to the maxims of the "Sermon on the Mount"

The Christian virtues grew out of the Sermon on the Mount and were more definitively presented by the Early Church Fathers in their teachings.

The source of good government is the good society, which in turn is founded on the good man or woman who willingly accepts God's grace to live the virtues and become a light that radiates out to a world that has many dark corners in it. If enough people live the virtues that will be reflected in the society they live in and in its politics. First we need to get our own house in order and then radiate that order and the harmony that goes with it to family, community and society. Jesus respected the politicians of his day provided they worked for the common good and the Church respects the politicians of our time. It regards politics as being necessary for the good
