## Review, pray & plan

With the lovely weather here for the past while summer has taken over Ireland. Usually summer months are quieter in parishes, giving the pastoral team time to review, reflect, pray and to plan ahead for the year ahead. In particular when it comes to Sacra-



mental preparations parishes have adapted to new situations and realities. With the World Meeting of the Families being held in Dublin this August the chances of having a quiet summer are slim however this doesn't mean we won't take time to respond to new challenges we as a Church and our parishes are facing. Only in January this year we introduced a Welcoming Ceremony for families seeking the Sacrament of Baptism for their child/children. We hope that young families feel welcome and experience how wonderful and empowering it can be when we come together as a parish, as brothers and sisters to celebrate our family of faith.

Last summer we also introduced "Faith Fun and Friendship" for children preparing for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. As we embrace the diocesan policy, one further element is that five of the seven parish schools are moving the celebration of First Holy Communion onto the Sunday Liturgy during May 2019. (The other schools will follow in 2020). The pastoral team is working hand and hand with principals and parents. We are listening to their concerns and hopes for the year ahead. The hope is that many will see the wonderful opportunities these new realities are giving to us a community of worshipers. Over the next few months we will share further details about these new opportunities for us as a parish community.

## Five tips for family faith

Ahead of the World Meeting of Families in August, here are 5 simple tips for families to bond in faith over the summer.

Family Prayer: Set aside a few moments to be together as a family to pray. This is a sacred time for that family. If any member of the family is out of the house, let them be united to the family in prayer wherever they are.

**No-Phone Hour:** Have a gadget-free hour in the family at least once a week in order to spend quality time together. Mobile phones can be in silent or on airplane mode.

Family Etiquette: Learn to be sincere, gentle and polite with each other both in word and deed. Remember that your words can heal or hurt people. "In the family, three words need to be used. Three words: 'Please', 'Thank you', 'Sorry'. Three essential words!" (Pope Francis)

Moral Formation: Parents should observe, accompany and educate their children as regards their moral life. Parents need to educate them on the responsible use of the media, especially the social media. "Only if we devote time to our children, speaking of



important things with simplicity and concern, and finding healthy ways for them to spend their time, will we be able to shield them from harm" (Pope Francis).

**Domestic Church:** A family is a mini Church where there is the celebration of sacraments, life, love and prayer. Let family together

participate in the Sunday Mass at the parish church. Let the whole family regularly participate in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, be actively involved in the catechesis and other ministries of the parish.




