a pigeon hole - it everything. But a Mass encapsulates to live in the tension opposing realities. world with our world that is to




wants to categorize prayer we often say at how Christians are meant of two apparently "We live in this passing minds fixed firmly on the come"

The Our Father teaches us how to properly prioritize the things of Heaven and the things of the world. First we give honour to God the Father of all that is created both spiritual and material. We must pray that His will be done on this earth as it is done in Heaven by the angels and the saints. This is the priority of all who love God—"seek first the Kingdom of God and everything will be given to you". Once we have prioritized honour to God then we turn our attention to the things of the world and our material needs. "Give us this day our daily bread" - in other words we ask the Lord to provide for our material needs—both for our physical and physiological well-being.

The problem with the world we live in is that it has turned the priority we have just mentioned on its head. We are enthralled by our daily bread and we over indulge in the material be it food, clothes, electronic devices, entertainment, political issues and God hardly gets a look in if at all. So we must re-orient ourselves to words of Jesus in the Our Father and pray that His name be honoured (Continued on last Page

ON THIS DAY!

On this day, Sunday 5th July 1857 the foundation stone of our church was laid by His Grace the Most Rev. Paul Cullen, Archbishop of Dublin. In a container placed under the stone are some coins of Pope Pius 1X and of the Queen Victoria along with an inscribed parchment.

In 1844 Fr. Moore, then curate of Clondalkin, Lucan and Palmerstown bought 20 acres of land from Mr. Hegarty for £300 and a yearly rent of £25. This money came from the legacy of Miss Anne Caldbeck.

....Fr. Moore then parish priest, held a parochial meeting in the Chapel House. He proposed the erection of a new church. It is recorded that his suggestion was responded to "in a manner unprecedented in the Annals of Chapel building in Ireland". Certainly a large sum of money was pledged with many parishioners subscribing £50 to £100 each.

Ireland then was just recovering from the effects of the Famine and money must have been scarce but having a place of worship then as now was important.
