ST. Valentines Day How was this Valentine's day for you? Did you get or send a card! I remember as a kid waiting for the postman to see if I was going to have a good day or not! I think today its more a case of checking your inbox. Valentine's Day is commonly the busiest restaurant day of the year after Mother's Day. Couples vie with each other to share protestations of love. Primary school

children share Valentines far and wide. How did this public demonstration of love get to be associated with St. Valentine? Who was he? What might it mean for us today?

One tradition about the likely association between lovers and St. Valentine is the medieval belief that birds (the feathered kind) would choose their partner on his day!

Valentine is the name of two saints, one a bishop and one a priest, who were martyred in the middle of the third century and honoured on Feb. 14. The most popular tradition comes from the Medieval period that held that this particular Valentine, a priest, was marrying Christian couples in a time when the Roman emperor prohibited young men from marrying. For this crime, he was arrested and killed by the Roman government. In recent times, an addition to this story claims that Valentine, before his death, sent a love note to a young girl whom he loved, signing it, "From your Valentine." Because the facts of these lives are very sketchy, St. Valentine's Day was not included in the most recent version of the calendar of saints. Feb. 14 is now the memorial of Saints Cyril and Methodius, the apostles to the Slavs and the subject of an encyclical of Saint John Paul II. From that reference until now, St. Valentine's Day has been associated with the idea that it is a good thing for two people in love to affirm that to each other - and to tell the world too!

Although the idea that Valentine's Day is for lovers may be based on conceptions of animal behavior and a chance mention in a poem, or on the heroic priest Valentine - the actual focus on telling others that they are loved is something that emerges from a scriptural truth: God is love and we are loved! And where there is love there is God. Whether commercialized or not these days it is good to have a day when we remember to tell those who mean the most to us that they are loved, they are special and that our world would be less without them.



"I guess you can do anything you want with the Beatitudes. Some have ignored them, some have admired them and walked away, some have used them as a yardstick to measure their own blessedness, and some have used them to declare revolution. The simplest thing to do with them, perhaps, is to let them stand you on your head so that you cannot see the world again in the same way but rather the way God sees it - turned upside down by the only one who really knows which way is up." What's so great about being poor, or hungry, or sad? On the surface, these Beatitudes of Jesus seem very strange: 'How happy are you who are poor'. Surely it is better to be wealthy, to be well fed, and to enjoy good times – or to at least be

comfortable and content?

But Jesus is not interested in comfort, or in maintaining the status quo. The Jesus of Luke's Gospel is something of a revolutionary. He has come to turn the social order on its head: last becomes first and least becomes greatest. His concern is always for the poor and marginalized. Jesus' vision is of a world where the unjust structures that cause poverty, hunger and oppression are swept away. Sadly, as we hear on the news every day, inequalities in our world with regard to wealth, education, health and opportunities remain as stark as ever. Speaking about how we can tackle injustice today, Pope Francis has offered six 'new Beatitudes' for the modern Christian. Like the teachings of Jesus, they remind us that the task of the Christian is to tackle injustice and to act in solidarity with those on the margins of society. Pope Francis' 'new Beatitudes' include: Blessed are those who renounce their own comfort in order to help others. Blessed are those who look into the eyes of the abandoned and marginalized and show them their closeness. Blessed are those who protect and care for our common home. Triona Doherty

Sean, a Clondalkin native, was seriously injured in an unprovoked assault while attending a soccer match in Liverpool. He is a former Round Tower player and former Executive Member. He is undergoing an intensive program of rehabilitation and will continue to require ongoing and intensive long-term care and support. Ahead of the match, the GAA Club will also place collection boxes around Clondalkin village to enable people contribute to the fundraising drive.

Ed O'Malley, Round Tower GAA Club Chairman states: "Sean grew up in Clondalkin and represented the club for many years in a playing capacity and also at Executive level. He still retains a very close connection with the Clondalkin community, with family still living here. We hold great appreciation for the excellent contribution he made to our club on and off the playing pitches. We are very grateful to the family of our late friend Eugene Garrigan who are fully supportive of his second memorial tournament raising funds to support Sean's rehabilitation. The match presents an opportunity for us as a club and the wider Clondalkin community to show our solidarity with and support for Sean and the Cox family."
